This property is located in Cicero near Chicago's western neighborhoods of Little Village and Lawndale. Sitting on 10.4 acre, this single story building contains 750 self storage units and approximately 65,000 square feet of rentable self storage space and another 85,000 square feet of rentable industrial space. Converted to state-of-the-art part-climate controlled self storage space in 2002, the western portion of the asset features a wide interior complete drivethru lane, spacious covered interior loading docks, and interior and exterior vehicle parking space. Security features include 24/7 digital surveillance, video monitors and digital keypad access and fencing around the perimeter of the property.

## LOCATION

Chicago is the largest incorporated area within the Chicago Region and is the seat of Cook County. The city is a major Great Lakes port and is considered the commercial, financial, industrial, and cultural center of the Midwest. The Chicago Region is a major warehouse and distribution hub, supported by its comprehensive

network of highway, water, rail and air routes. Its strategic location in the middle of the country and at the intersection of major interstate highways, rail lines, and air-routes makes Chicago an attractive locale for corporate headquarters, regional offices, warehouse/ distribution facilities, and manufacturing facilities. Fifty-six of the nation's Fortune 500 corporations are headquartered in the Chicago Region such as Boeing, Walgreens, Sears Holdings, Kraft Foods, Allstate, Motorola, Abbott Laboratories, McDonald's and United Airlines (UAL). Chicago's metropolitan region ranks as the third-largest in the United States with a population over 9 million in the nine-county region, and Chicago boasts a population of nearly 3 million. Chicago is comprised of a slightly younger population that is better educated and better compensated compared to the U.S. population. This population supplies a large and well diversified economy with the third-largest labor pool in the nation.

This property sits on the high-traffic roadway Ogden Avenue which has counts of over

22,000 vehicles passing by each day and providing high visibility. The Ogden Avenue facility serves Cicero, Berwyn and the nearby neighborhoods of Little Village and Lawndale. These neighborhoods are mature, established in-fill urban areas that consist of high density residential and commercial traffic. This provides a working class population density that is above average with over 277,943 people living within a three mile radius of the property.
